Substance Misuse –

Domestic Abuse – Advice will firstly be sought from the Community Social Worker on 01452426263. Help is available via an extended referral to GDASS.

Eating Disorders – Our PSHEE Curriculum focuses on a healthy diets and positive body image. The Medical Centre are on hand to help those pupils who need it. Referrals can be made to the Brownhills Clinic via the GP.

Female Genital Mutilation – It is mandatory to refer any suspected FGM cases to the police. This can be done by calling the at risk helpline on 01452426565. Mental Health Concerns – Pupils are monitored through our pastoral support system and at risk pupils are monitored through our Safeguarding Teams. All students have access to the School Counsellor, Medical Centre and Pastoral Teams. PSHEE focuses on positive mental health outcomes.
